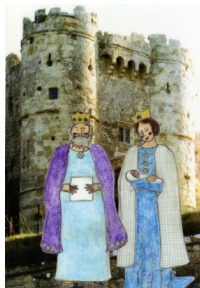

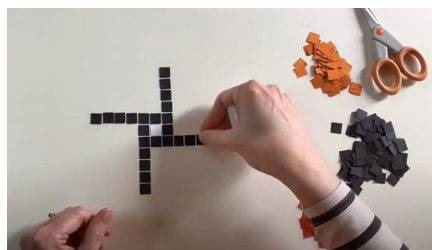


### Activities & Resources to support your visit
